

BREAKWATER DISTRICT



ROUTE STOP LOCATIONS

- *Please note we pick up at scheduled stops only
- 1 EMPRESS HOTEL (721 Government Street) Victoria's famous landmark hotel — tour the picturesque pathways and gardens or enjoy a full English afternoon tea (not included).
- 2 DELTA HOTEL / SONGHEES LOOKOUT

Cross the Johnson Street Bridge from Victoria's Old Town and explore the Songhees Walkway with trails to the north and west with beautiful views of the inner harbour and opportunities to enjoy Lekwungen art and learn about the Lekwungen language and culture.

3 OLD TOWN (1415 Government Street; corner of Pandora and Government) Brightly-painted Victorian -era shop fronts flank both sides of busy Lower Johnson and Yates Streets. Once home to hotels and stores during the Gold Rushes (1850s & 1890s).

GLOVER POIN

4 VICTORIA REGENT HOTEL / BASTION SQUARE (1234 Wharf Street) Only a short distance from the Regent Hotel, you will discover a great variety of popular attractions. Historic Bastion Square, whale watching excursions and some of the best waterfront dining Victoria has to offer.

- Washington. This is also the first stop in the lames Bay community — home to many of Victoria's key attractions. Walk next door to the Bateman Foundation Gallery of Nature and enjoy the interactive gallery overlooking the inner harbour.
- 6 COAST HOTEL / FISHERMAN'S WHARF (146 Kingston Street) Its waterfront location captivates guests with fantastic views of the calm waters and bustling marina.
- 7 FINEST AT SEA / FISHERMAN'S WHARF (BC Transit # 100086) Take a break, grab a coffee at the youth led Imagine Studio Cafe or borrow a blanket & frisbee from Finest At Sea.
- 8 THE BREAKWATER DISTRICT / CRUISE PORT (Dallas Road and Montreal St.). Ogden Point offers a variety of experiences with its popular 762m breakwater seawall, with the longest depicted First Nations art mural in Canada.

Another local favourite is the Breakwater Café. Enjoy a coffee and brunch or west coast comfort fare with stunning Juan de Fuca and Olympic Mountain views.

- (9) BEACON HILL PARK / MILE 0 (Douglas Street at the Petting Zoo) The start of Canada's Highway No.1, which stretches through all 10 provinces of Canada between our Pacific and Atlantic coasts, is one of the longest national highways, spanning 8,030 kms (4990 miles). The Terry Fox monument marks the spot where his original Marathon of Hope was to end.
- (10) CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL (Quadra at Rockland Street) One of Victoria's historical landmarks built in 1896, Christ Church Cathedral is the episcopal seat of the Bishop of the Diocese of British Columbia. It is built in the Gothic style of the 13th century to the design of J.C.M. Keith, who won an international competition in 1896 to obtain this commission.

- (12) OAK BAY VILLAGE / MUNICIPAL HALL (2167 Oak Bay Avenue) Join hundreds of visitors who enjoy this quaint English outpost for coffee, lunch or afternoon tea every day!
- (13) OAK BAY MARINA (1327 Beach Drive) Enjoy a panoramic view of the US San Juan Islands and distant Cascade Mountains or stroll north to sandy Willows Beach.
- (14) OAK BAY BEACH HOTEL (1175 Beach Drive) The legendary and redefined Oak Bay Beach Hotel is a beautiful Tudor -inspired, luxury oceanfront boutique hotel and spa.
- (15) COOK STREET VILLAGE (313 Cook Street) The pedestrian-friendly streets and small town atmosphere of Cook Street Village make it one of Victoria's most popular destinations.
